All In Guatemala! Update

Covid-19 is a global pandemic. Everyone knows that. But it is easy to forget our brothers and sisters who live in the mountains of Guatemala. This "calamity," as they call it, s worse there in many ways. On March 17, the day after our team came home, the Guatemalan government closed the airports and issued an immediate stay at home order for the whole country. All businesses were closed; transportation stopped; and travel to neighboring towns was prohibited. ALL Guatemalans are still required to wear masks anytime they are out of their homes or face a very steep fine.

Most of these people live on a very day-to-day basis and had no opportunity or ability to stock up as we did. All tourism, a major factor of their income, was halted immediately. Most of the families lost at least a part, if not all, of their earnings, with no opportunity to resume their crafts and trade. Many of them had no food and were facing starvation. Pieces of white cloth hung from doorways to show that the residents were in dire need.



In light of this, All In Guatemala! made a very quick pivot to address the current needs. Our coordinators and their families have been filling their pickup trucks with bags of dried corn and beans and taking them out to those in need. So far, we have distributed baskets of food to over 10,000 people!

Realizing that the only hope for relief is the next crop of corn and that fertilizer for this year's crop was a necessity, our microfinance program has made loans for more than 30,000 lbs. of fertilizer.

We have been amazed that our Guatemalan families still see the urgency of pure water and clean air. Even in these dire straits, they continue to strive to pay their portions and we continue to build stoves and supply water filters for all who participate.

There are many people right here at home who are hurting as a result of Covid-19 and there are many ways you and I can help them. However, our sisters and brother in Guatemala need our help, too.
