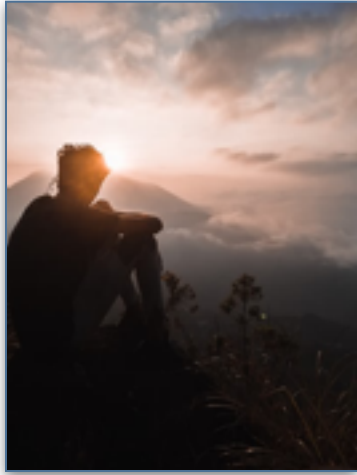


# In the flurry of living life, building ministries, and caring for others, how do we cultivate intimacy with God?

***School of the Spirit***, embarking on its eleventh year, is a distinctive, intense, one-year journey into contemplative practices that bring the seeker closer to God. ***School of the Spirit*** is distinctive in at least three ways:

- the strength from diversity that comes from openness to seekers from all Christian denominations;
- a focus on Jesus' spiritual practices and other ancient disciplines - *not on the latest fad or way to fix oneself*;
- and a vital and committed community to hold each participant's journey. Through the living process of placing ourselves vulnerably before God and each other, to be schooled by the Holy Spirit, God's love and grace renews our minds and revives our spirits. Our ministries are enlivened and our yoke becomes easy as we abide ever more deeply in the freedom, care and love of God.

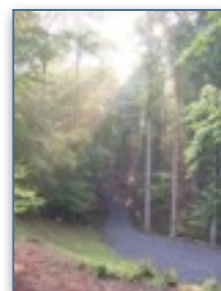
## Program Description

Over the course of the year, students read books and articles, view life-changing documentaries, engage in and experiment with a variety of spiritual formation activities and practices, develop a spiritual community with a small group of co-learners, and experience ten days of teaching and formational activities built around time-tested concepts. This robust curriculum helps the students become more open, receptive, and responsive to God's transforming grace in our individual lives.

Because we know real growth happens slowly over time, each retreat invites you to engage in particular spiritual practices, giving you space over the quarter to practice what you learned at the retreat and integrate it into your life and leadership.

### All retreats follow a similar format:

- There are times for learning, reflection, engagement, worship, and silence - silence so you can pay attention and give voice to what is going on in your own soul.
- In between times, you will have monthly practice assignments to further support your experimentation with the various practices and experiences.
- To further enhance your inner transformation, you are asked to reach out to one or more of your classmates via a monthly accountability relationship to nurture your covenant journey toward God.
- In addition, you are highly encouraged to seek out a soul friend or spiritual director to accompany you on this journey.
- In large group, small group, and solitary times, this work is about reclaiming the best gift you have to give, your God-self, your truest self.
- Our aim is, with your help, to create a safe space that fosters listening to how God is calling, empowering, and leading you to cultivate intimacy with God that manifest in compassionate service and missional impact for the sake of others.

Each retreat begins on Monday at 1:00 pm (except first retreat which begins at 10:00 am), until 8:00 pm and continues on Tuesday from 9:00 am until 3:30 pm.

### Retreat Location

In an effort to keep cost to a minimum, retreats are held at the Starrette Farm Retreat. The retreat house is located at 204 Pecan Tree Lane, Statesville NC, 28625. Established in 1888, the private homestead spans 50 acres of rolling woodland and walking trails. Only five minutes from the intersection of I-40 and I-77 on Highway 64 East, the Farm is a "day apart" venue only. In a further effort to keep costs low, *lodging is on your own and not included in retreat cost*. Statesville has numerous hotel options only ten minutes or less from the retreat house.

## Cost and Registration

The cost is \$950 for the twelve-month experience (*valued at \$1500 per student*). Generous financial support from the Western North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church Leadership Development Team makes it possible to offer *School of the Spirit* at this greatly reduced price.

- \$50 non-refundable deposit is due with your application.
- \$950 is payable upon acceptance - (\$79/month - does not include application fee)
  - \* For WNCU United Methodist clergy and lay ministry professionals, the cost is only \$450 for the twelve-month experience (does not include the \$50 non-refundable application fee). \*\* Please confirm with Rev. 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## **PERSONAL DISCERNMENT**

Because the program makes a significant financial investment in its participants, it is necessary for participants to discern if *School of the Spirit* is right for you at this time. Consider the following discernment questions before you apply:

- Are you able to attend all sessions?
- Do those you are responsible for (work, staff, members to whom you report) know of your interest in *School of the Spirit*? Is there anyone with whom you need to have a conversation before beginning? Any support staff/lay leadership you need to put in place should something arise? - *because it will!* What, if anything, would you need from them to participate fully and freely?
- Consider the same questions in regard to your family.
- Are there any current priorities you need to consider re-arranging, or special circumstances you need to consider to be able to fully participate?

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APPLICATION continued. *Take some time to prayerfully respond to the following questions:*

1. What draws you to participate in *School of the Spirit (SOS)* at this point in your life and ministry? How do you hope to benefit?
  
2. Briefly describe your prayer life and the spiritual practices you engage in regularly.
  
3. How do these practices address your spiritual needs, sustain and enliven you?
  
4. What is your experience with the ancient spiritual practices of a) Spiritual Direction (group and/or individual), b) Centering Prayer, c) *lectio divina*?

5. When was the last time you were part of a spiritual retreat in which you were not a leader?
6. In your life/ministry at this time, what feeds your soul? What drains or discourages you?
7. What are the biggest blocks you experience to living a life of peace, joy and freedom?
8. Fast forward to the end of your *School of the Spirit* one-year experience. Briefly describe how you hope your life/ministry will be different due to the soul strengthening wisdom received.
